### Lap Time

Through their relationships with other people, infants learn how to apply and use their own emotions and expressions. Language & social development are stimulated by pleasant. nurturing interactions with others.





## **Pumpkins**

Art is a hands-on learning experience. Exploring a pumpkin (inside and out!) helps children become more familiar with this seasonal item; related thematic art activities (painting pumpkins or creating a fall collage) make more sense because children have prior knowledge of what a pumpkin really is.





#### Story Time

Through early exposure to books, young children acquire the preliminary tools they'll need to become readers and writers. A lifelong love of learning begins with a good book!





#### **Tunnel Time**

Lots of opportunities to stretch, crawl and explore enhance infants' gross motor development and help them learn more about their bodies and their surroundings.





# Sensory Bins

Tactile learning experiences reinforce curriculum themes and pique the interest of young learners. Playing with colorful, crunchy, autumn leaves in the sensory bin encourages a practical understanding of the season.





## **Block Play**

Blocks, puzzles, and other manipulatives are used to build the important fine motor skills that will later be used for writing. As children play, they also learn more about cause & effect and problem solving.
